
Education Programs

Thrive's Education Programs help youth ages 12-24 who are struggling to stay in school, or have left.

Youth at Promise is a foundational literacy and numeracy program for youth 16+ who have dropped out of school. *Springboard GED* is a GED preparation program for learners 18+ who have not finished high school and wish to complete their graduate equivalency exam. *Rogers BreakThru* supports youth between 12 and 16 who want to stay in school, but need additional supports to do so.

Street Reach

Street Reach is a barrier-free service using harm reduction principles to offer outreach and follow-up support to those who are homeless or at risk of being homeless. Street Reach provides support to individuals of all ages. Some of the services available include: food, outdoor clothing, condoms, personal care items, supportive and caring interactions, assistance with accessing emergency housing, telephone access, safe drug use equipment, information and referrals to available external services.

Velocity Adventure

Velocity is a one year adventure-based program for youth ages 13-18 to build life skills, foster personal development, build positive interpersonal and community relationships and encourage healthy choices. All activities are free and no experience is required. Meals, supplies, equipment, and transportation are provided.

Community Support and Development

Thrive provides support and services to professionals working with young people across all sectors such as: bimonthly professional development and networking opportunities; daily community newsletter; directory of services for youth; annual professional development training; facilitation services; community development and capacity building; and self-care support.

Coalition Against the Sexual Exploitation of Youth (CASEY)

CASEY is a coalition of community stakeholders working to create awareness and understanding of the sexual exploitation of youth as well as establish services and supports for those who are impacted by sexual exploitation.

Coalition for Educational Opportunities

CEO is a collaboration of community stakeholders across all sectors committed to creating an environment where youth are able to learn through alternative education programs and services. The CEO raises awareness on the extent of and the factors impacting school drop outs; supports existing alternative education programs and services; and seeks opportunities to collectively identify and implement innovative solutions.
