Learning Resources Program Counsellor (Permanent)

Summary:

Under the supervision of the Director, the Counsellor delivers evidence-based correctional programs with the fundamental objective of reducing the risk of re-offending.

Responsibilities:

- Delivers evidence-based programs either in a group and/or individual setting, in the community and institutions.
- Completes file reviews, assessments and reports as required.
- Maintains accurate electronic and manual client records.
- Conducts research to ensure that program standards, content and techniques are current with correctional research.
- Maintains collaboration with John Howard Society programs and partner agencies for the purpose of case management, alternative program referral and client advocacy.
- Attends program related meetings.
- Contributes to the orientation/training of staff/interns/volunteers.
- Develops and presents information sessions to clients and community agencies.
- Engages in professional development as required.
- Ensures confidentiality guidelines are met regarding staff and client information.
- Shares responsibility for maintaining a safe, secure environment for both staff and clients.
- Performs other related duties as required by the director.

Qualifications:

- University degree in Social Work, Criminology or the social sciences. (ie: psychology, sociology or education)
- Demonstrated knowledge and a minimum of two years experience delivering cognitive/behavioural counselling approaches in both individual and group settings.
- Experience with and a demonstrated understanding of the offender population.
- Broad understanding of the criminal justice system.

Transitions to Work Employment Program

Are you?

- Unemployed
- Currently receiving income support, or feel you would qualify for income support, if you applied.
- Non EI eligible
- Between the ages of 19 and 45 years
- Have a minimum of grade ten high school completed; and
- Interested in obtaining a job.

Transitions to Work is a nine-week workplace readiness program starting in mid-November 2018. The program offers the opportunity to:

- Obtain help with problem solving, workplace communications, budgeting skills;
- Explore personal strengths and interests and match these strengths to occupations that may be a good fit for you;
- Obtain workplace certificates such as First Aid; WHMIS; Back Injury Prevention, etc.
- Up-date and practice your work search skills; and
- Receive one-on-one coached job search support.

Program Participants may be eligible for:

- A start-up allowance
- A monthly stipend
- Transportation costs
- Assistance with childcare costs
